How to Survive the End of the World — Week 3 — Snapshots of Revelation

The central character of Revelation is Jesus Christ. In Revelation, we no longer see Him as a suffering servant but as returning King, Victor over death and hell, King of kings and Lord of lords. As we read Revelation we are forced to conclude that every knee will bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is LORD!

- How does reading Revelation change your outlook on your present circumstances?
- What are some inaccurate views of Jesus? How does reading Revelation give you a more complete picture of Christ?
- Revelation 4:8 says, “Day and night they never stop saying; “Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty, who was, and is, and is to come.” What makes Jesus worthy of our worship?
- How does knowing that everything of value will be placed at Jesus’ feet change your attitude toward wealth? (Revelation 4:10-11, 5:12)
- How should our view of heaven impact our view of church? (Revelation 7:9-10)
- On a scale of one to ten, how would you rate your urgency to share the gospel? Why should we be urgent?

In Revelation all that was broken is restored: all that is wrong is made right. Once and for all evil is destroyed and there will be peace. No more worry, no more pain, no more sickness or death. If we believe that to be true, our lives should be filled with urgency to share the good news of Jesus Christ. It is through Him alone that people will be able to experience this incredible future.
